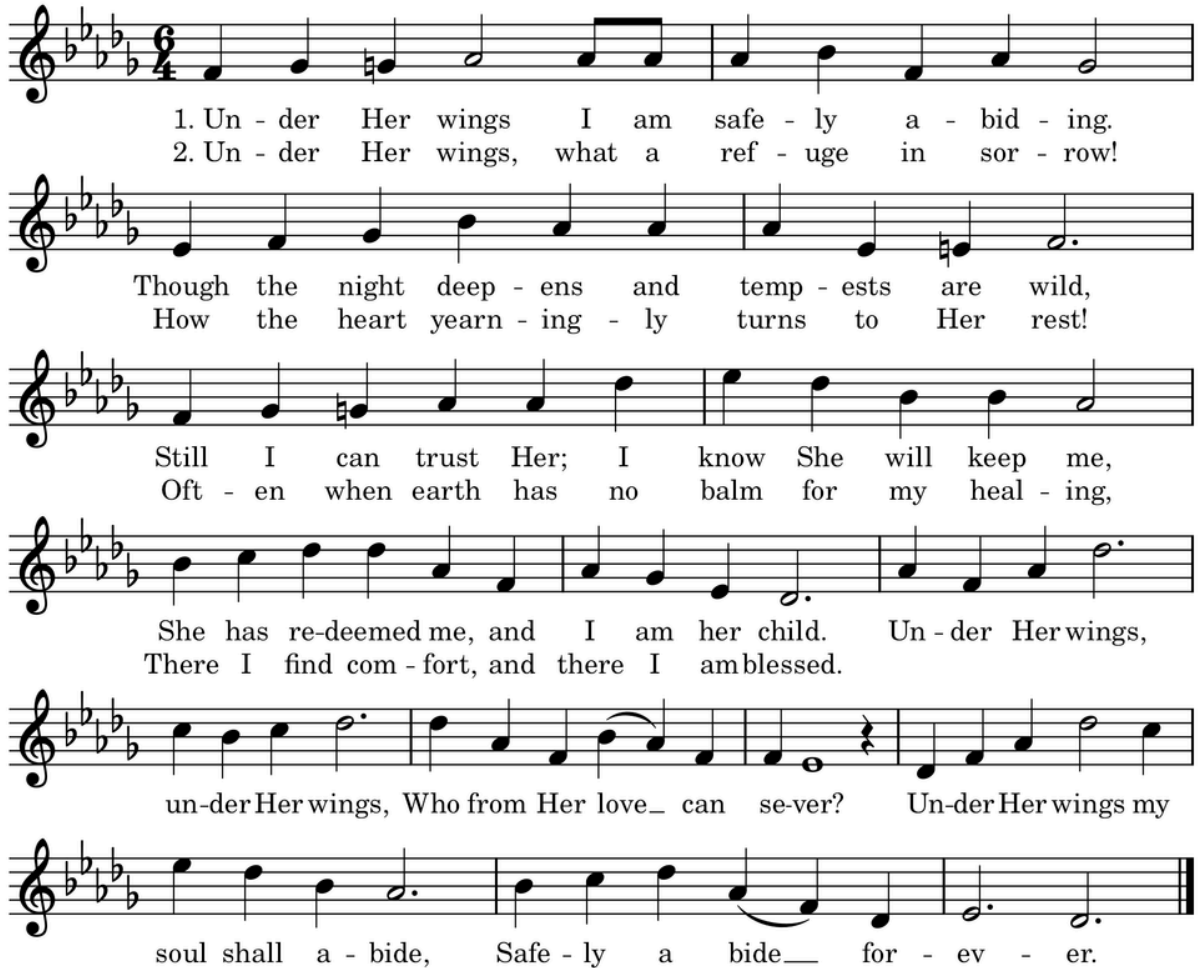

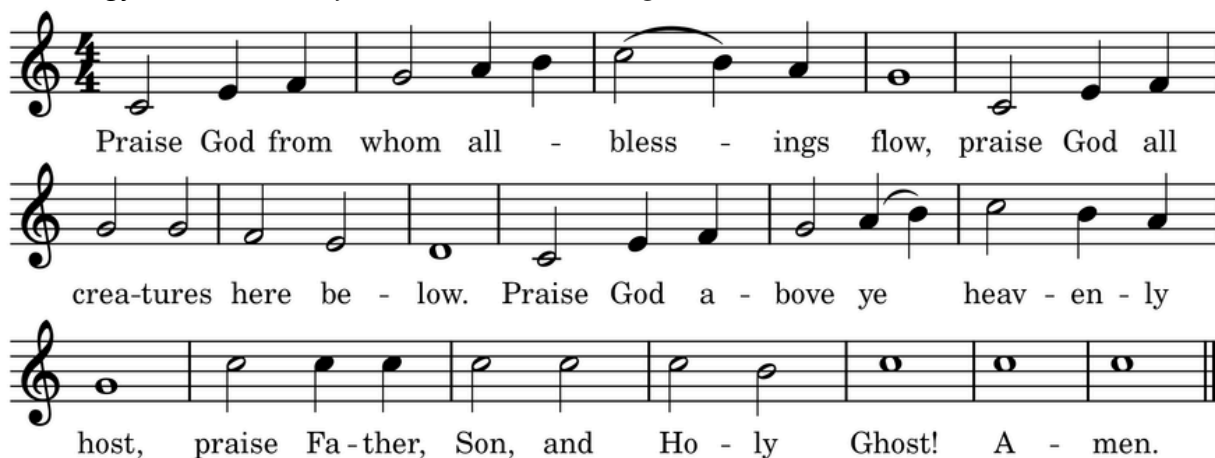

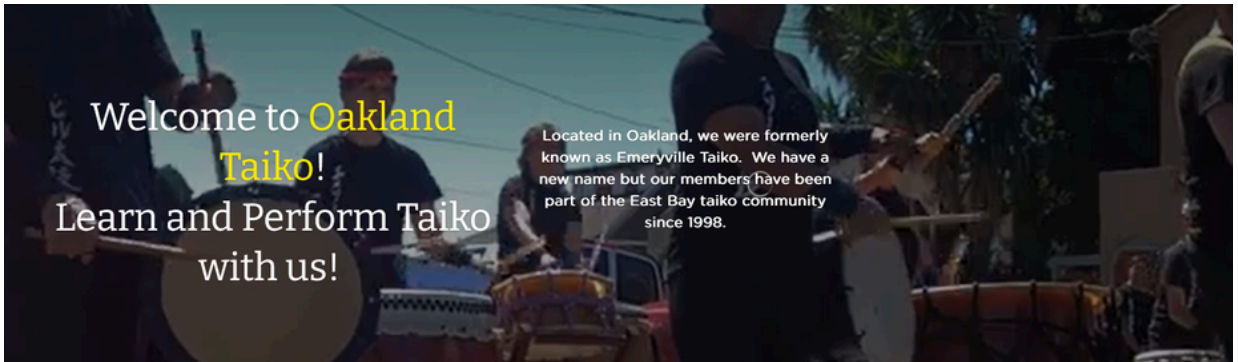
Join Us for a Roots Game!

New Tenant! Oakland Taiko



Please welcome a new tenant to the First Church campus: Oakland Taiko is making their new home on the 3rd Floor of the Parish House Building. Session Elders have been working with the group on sounds testing, scheduling, and sound mitigation to ensure that this is a positive experience for everyone on the campus and that the sacredness of the space is preserved.

We are confident that Oakland Taiko will be a blessing to the community in many ways. Read on to learn more about who they are.

Oakland Taiko is a California nonprofit organization that has been providing Japanese Taiko drumming instructions for over 25 years. The mission of Oakland Taiko is to build a creative and collaborative Taiko community through classes, workshops, and performances. We strive to be inclusive and inviting, creating a friendly community space for learning and teaching the art of taiko drumming with Joy and rigor. In our repertoire and our teaching, we seek to honor taiko's cultural origins in Japan but also innovate with a California twist. Through our performances and workshops, we aspire to share the joy of taiko with the larger Bay Area community and increase public awareness of taiko as a tool of self-empowerment and self-expression.

As an entirely volunteer-led and run group, Oakland Taiko is made possible by continually empowering students to take leadership in the group. Every week, the dojo offers six low-cost, rigorous classes at a variety of levels, including taiko and fue (Japanese flute), that introduce students to the art form in the tradition of martial arts. Students refine their drumming technique, practice drills, and learn songs, but also receive regular instruction on proper dojo culture and etiquette, Japanese vocabulary, and cultural lessons on the origins and evolution of the art form.

Liturgy For the People and By the People



Each Sunday, we gather to worship in community to worship God. We follow a traditional order of worship (call to worship/prayer, confession, prayers of the people, scripture/sermon, offering/communion, benediction) to connect with our past and as a backbone for creative ways of expressing our faith. Sometimes we lift up our voices in prayer and other times we write them down and attach them to our prayer tree. Jake and Pastor Matt meet each week to reflect upon the past worship service and to plan upcoming gatherings. Pastor Matt chooses scriptures and themes that connect with our ongoing spiritual formation as a church community. We seek to be guided by a diversity of voices in prayers and music that reflect God's beloved community.

We wanted to invite the creativity of our whole church community by sharing the upcoming themes for our worship gatherings. Do these themes remind you of a story from the bible? A poem? Or piece of art? Would you like to write a prayer? Is there a song that comes to mind? Would you like to design the cover of the bulletin for one of these months?

Here are the themes:

May – Exile and Return – looking at the warnings of the prophets, the people of God being taken into exile and ultimately returning; God's faithfulness through it all

June – Pride month – expanding our understanding of God's beloved community

July – Poetry and Spirituality – allowing the imagination and creativity of poets to expand our understanding of sacred scriptures - do you have a favorite poet that you think would work well? (Mary Oliver was our poet last year)

August – We will use one parable and look at it from different angles for four weeks – do you have a favorite parable or story you think we should use? (Last year we reflected on the parable of the Good Samaritan)

Rose Mary loved our church history and used to conduct impromptu church tours, based on information that she got from Rev. John Turpin, who shared the same love of the sanctuary and our connections to the community. She taught me a lot and I eventually took her notes and came up with an updated script so I too, could answer questions from newcomers who came to Sunday services. I remember when she took over as Treasurer from Larry Weseman (who was an accountant) and we all struggled to unravel his rather complicated church finance books. But she, as always, prevailed. We partnered (albeit a bit grudgingly at times) over finances and grew to respect each other's strengths and sometimes different ways of doing things – I could always count on her to share her opinion! She was a member of Lakeshore Women (and a past President) and was always someone who could be counted on to roll up her sleeves and help.

Rose Mary Richmond was a long-time member of First Presbyterian Church of Oakland. She was very proud of being the Church Treasurer. I was part of the three-member team that counted the Church Offering on Monday mornings at 10:00 a.m. for years. Each of us had a job: I handled the checks, Rose Mary was the brains in the group, and Bill Bradshaw helped with sorting the money and took the counted offering in an old brown leather zippered briefcase to the bank.

Rose Mary was an active member and leader of the Lakeshore Women's group, a group of church women who raised money that was used for many projects at the church, including drapes for the the Fellowship hall, cement walkways and repairs, Sanctuary railings, dishes and silverware for the kitchen, etc.



Rose Mary had strong opinions and was not afraid to share them with you. I will miss her kindness and eagerness to answer questions, or help whenever asked or there was a need.

She was usually on the front lines in the kitchen and Fellowship hall whenever there were potluck lunches or celebrations. She loved being part of hospitality events. We ate out together frequently at local places before evening committee meetings, Womens' Circle or Godly Play for Adults and every time she would insist on treating me because as she put it, "you are doing God's work in this place and we have so much fun together too." I have missed seeing her at church and will always remember her sparkling eyes, her easy laughter and her strong, stoic and resolute spirit. I was reminded of that on my last visit with her in mid April. Even though she was confined to bed all she wanted to express was her gratitude for the caregivers around her.
